2023 GENERAL ELECTION: PORTAL FOR AD-HOC STAFF APPLICATION OPENS 14^{TH} SEPTEMBER

The Independent National Electoral Commission has announced the opening of an online portal for interested qualified Nigerians who wish to serve as adhoc staff in the 2023 General Election to apply.

The Commission in a notice signed by the Acting Director, Electoral Operations department, Akeem Adigun said the portal, <u>pres.inecnigeria.org</u> will be opened from Wednesday 14th September 2022, by 8:00 am and close on Wednesday, 14th December, 2022 by 08:00pm.

It advised applicants to fill the registration forms online – The MOBILE APP (for android phone only) or Web Portal (using the laptop/PCs) to be eligible for consideration as ad-hoc staff in the 2023 General Election.

It explained that the portal is open for applications for the positions of Supervisory Presiding Officers (SPOs), Presiding Officers (POs), Assistant Presiding Officers (APO), Registration Area Technicians (RATECHs), and Registration Area Centre (RAC) Managers.

It stressed that Applicants must **not** be a political party member and must **not** have demonstrated or expressed support for any candidate or party. Applicants must reside in the state selected, it added.

INEC/IFES AGREE TO DEEPEN COLLABORATION AHEAD OF 2023 GENERAL ELECTION

The Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) and one of its long-standing development partners, the International Foundation for

Electoral Systems (IFES) have agreed to deepen their ties and work more closely ahead of the 2023 General Election.
